



## Mid-South Christian College Reopen Safe Plan

Mid-South Christian College currently plans to reopen with Face to Face classes beginning August 10, 2020. A Distance Learning Option will be made available for students who are concerned about returning to Face to Face classes.

The facilities are being thoroughly cleaned and sanitized, and will be prepared and ready for students to return in August.

### Dorm Check-In

- Dorms will be open and available for move-in beginning Sunday afternoon, August 2, 2020 at 1:00 pm through Sunday, August 9<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 pm.
- Before moving into dorms all students must complete a self-screening form, indicating they are free of symptoms and have not knowingly been in the presence of someone who has tested positive for COVID 19 in the previous 2 weeks.
- Students will also be asked to sign an Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Liability form.

### Daily Check-In For Classes

- Each day of class students will be asked to respond to a self-screening questionnaire indicating they are free of symptoms.
  - The easiest way to respond will be through a smart phone app called “#CampusClear”.
    - This app is currently available for free in the iPhone App store and the Google Play Store. If you have a smart phone, please go ahead and download the app.
    - Each day you will be prompted by #CampusClear to answer a question determining your clearance to enter the Classroom/Administration Building. If cleared, the App will give you a GREEN screen indicating your status.
    - If you are experiencing any of the symptoms listed on the App you will not be allowed in the Classroom/Administration Building until your health can be further evaluated. You may be asked to get tested for Covid 19 Coronavirus.
  - If you do not have a smart phone, you will be able to answer the daily question and receive a “Green” pass at the front door of the Classroom/Administration Building. In order to keep a record of student health, you will receive a daily email to ask you to respond to the same questions presented in the app.

- To enter the Classroom/Administration Building everyone will use the Double Glass Doors (closest to the Dorms) on the South end of the building. This will be an Entrance Only door, and the side door (currently used most often for entry) will be designated as an Exit Only door.
  - The round Welcome Kiosk is placed at the front entrance, and someone will be stationed there to take the temperature of all Faculty, Staff, Students, and Visitors entering the building.
  - You will show your “Green Pass”, have your temperature taken, and be asked to sanitize your hands upon entrance.
  - Face Coverings or Masks will be required in the Classroom/Administration Building in all of the public areas (hallways, bathrooms, and reception area). Although not required in the classrooms, face coverings are recommended at all times in the building.
  - The side door to the parking lot will be designated as the only Exit Door for the building.

#### Social Distancing

- Administrative Offices
  - In order to ensure proper distancing, students will not be allowed past the counter in the reception area without permission.
  - Administrative staff will be asked to enter the office complex through the secondary door in order to maintain the reception area as free as possible of cross-traffic.
- Cafeteria
  - The cafeteria will have a maximum of 20 occupants at any one time. There will be 5 tables and we will ask students to limit themselves to 4 students per table.
  - Additional seating, if needed, will be available in room 12.
  - Administrative Staff members are encouraged to eat lunch in their offices if the cafeteria is at full capacity.
- Chapel
  - Chairs will be set in groups appropriately distanced from each other.
  - Students may sit next to their Dorm Suite Mates, but are encouraged to sit at a distance from other students.
- Classrooms
  - The college has purchased additional tables for classrooms which should permit students to spread themselves out at an appropriate distance.
  - Larger classes have been moved to the Dutka Memorial Chapel to allow for proper distancing.
- Student Activities
  - The Administration is recommending that the Student Council plan all group activities to allow for proper social distancing.
  - When possible, it is best to plan outdoor activities.
- Special Events on Campus
  - Procedures will be in place to protect the safety of students and visitors during special events on campus.

#### Hygiene and Disinfectants

- We will attempt to provide more work study hours to maintain sanitized public areas and clean bathrooms.
- Once a week the Classrooms and Public areas will be fogged with a disinfectant spray.
- Disinfectant wipes will be provided in each classroom and students will be asked to wipe down the space they will use prior to sitting down, and again after class prior to leaving the area.

#### Face Coverings and Masks

- Masks will be required in the following areas
  - Office Reception Area

- Hallways
- Bathrooms
- Resource Center (Additional regulations for the Resource Center will be posted.)
- In the cafeteria until seated with food
- Any indoor area where social distancing is not possible
- Masks are recommended for
  - Dorm common areas
  - Classrooms (Individual professors have the discretion to require masks in their classrooms.)

#### Students who test positive

- If a student tests positive for Covid 19 Coronavirus they will be quarantined for at least 3 days after their last symptoms disappear and they receive a negative test for coronavirus. Currently we have at least two rooms available if needed for quarantine.
- The cafeteria will facilitate contactless delivery of food for quarantined students.
- Students who test positive for Covid 19 Coronavirus will automatically be switched to the Distance Learning option for classes.
